

Dear Sir

I thank you for your letter of the 4th January, and now have much pleasure in sending you a larger & better photograph of my picture by De Mopper. I enclose also a sketch of the signature as it appears on the picture, for the photograph hardly shows it except perhaps through a microscope.

I may say that the picture is at present in the hands of Messrs. Thos. Agnew & Sons of 43 Old Bond Street London and if you have an Agent in London it might be worth asking

It has been suggested by Sir Robert Witt of the Witt Library London that the letters H F under the monogram might refer to Hieronymus Francken, who sometimes worked with De Mouper.

him to view and examine it. Its dimensions are 6 ft x 3 ft. and as I said in my first letter it requires cleaning and restoration where it has been damaged in the left-hand corner. Otherwise it is in excellent condition.

I have reason to believe that it is of considerable value and I am asking £150 for it.

It was to be put into the Autumn Sales of Messrs Christie of London but I withdrew it pending negotiations with prospective buyers.

I have an idea that ^{they} may have reference to another artist who may have been responsible for the group figures of the Holy Family which appear to me to have been added after the completion of the landscape. The point is interesting. I should be glad of your opinion.

As I said in my last letter, the picture is to be included in Christie's (London) Sales shortly; but if your Museum feels inclined to make a reasonable offer for it, I should be pleased to withdraw it from the sale, pending ~~negotiations~~ negotiations.
